<p>The generic pigment name is usually printed on the labels of most professional grade paints, pigments or other media. The Color Index is an internationally recognized standard of pigment classification.</p> <p>The Color Index uses the pigments basic usage, hue, and the unique pigment serial number (i.e. Pigment Red 102) to create an abbreviated name. An example would be; PB 29 for Pigment Blue 29, also called Ultramarine Blue.</p>
